
Another great picture, fantastic bird of prey.

Lots of detail in there—it's a striking pose. Another glorious picture.


Sometimes it's easier to comment on the photo's when they are not so good as one can find faults, but these are brilliant!


I love the title, very apt. The one leaf is very clear.

Such a nice clean look to this whole photo and it is very very pleasant.



'Floristic Fireworks'


At first glance, the photographs could be mistaken for an impressive New Year's Eve fireworks show, but looks can be deceiving. Andrew Baxter, Western Cape ecologist and photographer, stunningly captured South Africa's protea flowers in a different light.

The photographs of the protea flowers, which look more like floral fireworks than anything else, were taken by Baxter in the Kirstenbosch National Botanical Gardens at twilight. Unlike most photographers that set their alarms and flock to the gardens to catch flowers in the first light of the day, he took a different approach. According to Andrew Baxter, the secret is to get there at last light, "for at dusk the faeries come out and magic happens."






After posting his first series of photo's, it started snowballing and they went viral all the way to Russia and far beyond.
