
Your committee will be meeting on Saturday 6th August to bash out some future plans!



From Monday 01 August, an exhibition of the portrait photography of the late Cape Town Photographic Society member, Arnold Castle, can be viewed in the South African Jewish Museum in Cape Town. The exhibition, curated by his daughter Elana, will run during August and September. Prior to his death in 2020, Arnold had been a talented member of CPTS for 48 years.

The exhibition is named "The eternal scholar" after a portrait of a "Rabbi" that won him a gold medal in a Photographic Society of America salon.

His specialty is black and white portrait photography, and it was mainly from these images, taken with a square-formal Hasselblad during the 1970s and 1980s, that Elana curated the exhibition. Arnold was awarded FPSSA in monochrome prints in 1984.

He co-produced two exhibitions with his friend and fellow-CTPS member Roy Milington at the Shell Gallery and regularly judged salons and competitions.








FEATURE

Perhaps a similar project for other club members who grew up in the area in which they still live, or have easy & inexpensive access to, and are blessed enough to have old albums in their possession?





Patterns in nature/abstract

Explore patterns in nature from an abstract perspective.

Patterns in nature are visible regularities of form found in the natural world. Natural patterns include symmetries, trees, spirals, meanders, waves, foams, tessellations, cracks and stripes.

Let your imagination run free to create an effect disconnected from the obvious.

e.g. if there is a pattern on a rock, the focus would be on the pattern rather than the rock.

- Look for subjects with repeating shapes or tones
- Stare at it for a decent amount of time; don't rush to bring the camera to your eye
- Pick your area of focus, working with standard composition rules
- Look for other pictorial qualities that can manifest as patterns
- Pay careful attention to the light and shadows—often the contrast of harsh shadows can make less interesting subjects take on a whole new form
- Reflections can offer good opportunities
- Maximise depth of field
- Sharpness isn't always a necessity for photographing patterns in nature
