#### FEES PAYABLE

- 1. Participation Fee per club: R250-00 per club..
- 2. Entrance Fee per person: Each ticket will cost R80
- 3. Pre-Selling of tickets: In order to place not too severe a financial burden upon the host club, all participating clubs will be required to pre-sell a minimum number of tickets before the event. Our venue is smaller than that used last year so we will have to limit the number of tickets per club to 15. It is possible that one or more of the smaller clubs require less than this, if so, please let us know so that other clubs can take up the surplus. For this reason we suggest clubs requiring more than 15 tickets should advise us asap. The chairman of each club must advise the host club's co-ordinator of the number of tickets required, by September 30 with payment by the same date. Bank deposits or electronic transfers only to

Based on the Interclub rules as signed off by each club, we have detailed below the rules and procedures which Hermanus Photographic Society, as hosts, will follow on the evening.

#### **ENTRIES**

- 1. All work entered in this competition must have been entered for a competition or evaluation at the submitting club during the 12 months preceding the Interclub competition.
- 2. A member of more than one club can represent only one club with his/her prints and/or projected images.
- 3. Work of the appointed judges will not be entered.
- 4. **Film slides will not be accepted for projection**. However, scanned images may be entered as digital images as set out in the section Digital Images.

- 5. Each entry must be named as set out in the sections on Prints and Digital Images below.
- 6. A maximum of 24 entries per club is allowed, consisting of 12 prints and 12 projected images.
- 7. No more than 2 entries in total from any one member may be entered.

#### **Prints**

- 1. Prints must be mounted on board, but not framed or block-mounted.
- 2. Prints must be clearly marked by means of an arrow on the back, indicating the right way up.
- 3. The title of the print, the name of photographer and club must be clearly labeled on the back of the print.
- 4. The minimum size of a print (without its mount) is 150 mm x 200 mm. (6" x 8")
- 5. The maximum size of a print is 300 mm x 450 mm. (12" x 18")
- 6. The maximum size of the mount board may not exceed 400 mm x 550 mm.
- 7. No distinction will be made between hand-derived and machine prints.
- 8. So as not to have one print unduly standing out from the others, prints will be hung as follows: B&W first, then soft colours, then bright colours.

#### **Digital images**

- 1. Digital images must be in JPEG format
- 2. Digital images must be resized to a maximum of 1024(horizontal) x 768 (vertical) pixels.
- 3. File sizes for JPEG images may not exceed 500 Kb.
- 4 Each JPEG image file must be named as follows:
  - The file name must be in 3 groups, each separated by a hyphen.
    - i. The first group will represent the Club:
    - (A = Cape Town, B = Creative Camera Club, C = Fish Hoek, D = Helderberg, E = Hermanus, F = Tygerberg, G = Tafelberg, H = Paarl, J = Fotasie, K = Labori, L = Swartland followed by the numerical number of the picture in that division (e.g. 01, 02, 03 ... 12) Thenumber must always consist of 2 digits so as not to cause confusion with the way that computer files are stored.. (should a new club join the event then it will be allocated a new letter)
    - ii. The second group must include the author's name truncated to a maximum of 16 characters (e.g. johan botha).
    - iii. The third group must include the title truncated to a maximum of 24 characters (e.g. blue heron at dawn).
  - Only figures and letters, and eventually the hyphen (-) that separates the various groups may be used. The letters must be in lower case.
  - Example: A01-johan botha-blue heron at dawn.jpg
- N.B. The underscore from last year has been replaced with a hyphen to fit the new scoring programme that will be used.

#### Judges

- 1. The HPS shall nominate the judges, none of whom will be a member of any of the participating clubs.
- 2. There will be a panel of 3 judges.

#### Judging Procedure:

- 1. Each judge shall award points to each entry on a scale of one to ten.
- 2. Prints shall be properly exhibited and the title of each print shall be displayed below the print. Labels, printed by the HPS, are to be used for this purpose. Prints will be pre-judged on the morning of the Interclub event.
- 3. When displaying a digital image its title must be announced when it appears on the screen and then when the judges scores have been tallied the score and club name announced before proceeding to the next image.
- 4. Computers and/or score cards will be used.
- 5. The HPS will appoint scorekeepers and projectionists.

#### **Awards**

- 6. Certificates will be provided by the HPS.
- 7. Prizes will be provided by the HPS.

#### Club Awards

- 1. A certificate will be awarded to the club scoring the most points in the print section, and to the club scoring the most points in the projected images section.
- 2. The Interclub Floating Trophy and a certificate will be awarded to the club attaining First Place when the points accumulated in the print and digital images sections are added together. Certificates will be awarded to those clubs attaining Second and Third Places.
- 3. In the event of a tie in the print section, the projected image section or the overall event, certificates will be awarded to all clubs who have tied for a place and the trophy will be shared.
- 4. The winning club(s) must have the trophy engraved with their name(s) and the date of the competition.

#### Individual Awards

- Certificates will be awarded to the photographers scoring First, Second and Third places in both prints and projected images sections. It is up to HPS's discretion to award prizes.
- 2. These images will be displayed when the announcements are made.
- 3. In the event of a tie, it shall be up to the judges to decide the winner.
- 4. The Judges' decisions are final.
- 5. The Apple Award will be awarded to the photographer scoring the highest number of points for an image.
- 6. In the event of a tie for the Apple Award, the Judges will choose an outright winner.

#### **Judges Awards**

Each judge will choose his/her favourite image of the event, and this will be displayed when the Judges announce their choices.

#### **Handing In and Collection of Entries**

- Two Collection Points have been recognised: Tothills Pharmacy, Waterkant Street, Cape Town; and Picture Works, Plein Street, Stellenbosch. All entries, together with the Interclub Floating Trophy (which will have been inscribed by the previous winner/s), must be handed in at one of the collection points not later than Friday 15th October, 2010.
- 2. Each Club is responsible for obtaining a receipt from the collection point for all entries handed in, as any disputes cannot be addressed at a later stage.
- 3. Any late, or incorrectly sized or marked entries, will not be accepted.
- 4. All entries must be collected by the relevant clubs at the end of the competition evening.
- 5. Although every effort will be made to set up the digital projector in line with the generally accepted guidelines, no guarantee can be provided that images will perfectly match that which is displayed on another computer.
- 6. The Copyright of all images entered will be protected.

#### PROCEEDINGS ON THE EVENING

- 1. Parking is available inside the Municipal grounds, at guests' own risk.
- Guests may arrive from 1.30pm onwards, but not later than 2.30pm and judging
  of projected images will commence at 2.45pm sharp (the prints having been
  judged as per item 4 below) No late comers will be admitted to the auditorium
  after 2:30pm.
- 3. Viewing of the prints will take place in the Banqueting Hall of the Auditorium.
- 4. Pre-judging of the prints will have taken place in the morning.
- 5. There will be a cocktail party in the Banqueting Hall following the judging and prizegiving.
- 6. A program setting out the scheduling of the afternoon, will be available upon guests' arrival.
- 7. The afternoon should be concluded by 6 pm

The Port Elizabeth Camera Club is proud to host the Cape Photographers Congress in the town of Addo from Thursday 28 April till Monday 2 May.

Please note that the Congress is NOT IN the Addo Elephant Park itself, there is actually a little town about an hour's drive from Port Elizabeth, called **Addo**.

Addo lies in a beautiful part of the world, surrounded by contrasting dense thickets of Spekboom, open grassy patches and the odd wooded kloof. The area is alive with citrus estates, roses and an amazing bird life, not to forget of course the Addo Elephant Park right on its doorstep. The town lies in the Sundays River Valley surrounded by the Zuurberg Mountains that offer some spectacular hiking, horse riding trails and elephant back safaris. Photographic possibilities are endless.

The programme and costing is in its final stages but to ensure that you have plenty of time to plan and make your bookings this is an advance notice of the highlights of next years congress.

We are endeavouring to keep the cost as low a possible to make this congress affordable for everyone while maintaining the high standard that has become a tradition of the Cape Photographers Congresses.

The feedback forms completed by many of last years delegates have helped tremendously in the planning of next years event, thank you for your input.

Lunch and dinner will once again be included with the addition of fresh fruit and salad. The Women's Institute will be doing the catering so we should at least be able to match what we had in Struisbaai.

Although the town of Addo is rather small it does have a large hall with excellent facilities, the venue in Addo is the Valentine Hall which is airconditioned - there is also plenty of room so we shouldn't have a problem with seeing the screen which will be on the raised stage.

There is also plenty of accommodation in and around the area ranging from camping to luxury 5 Star accommodation. At sunrise each morning members of the Port Elizabeth Camera Club will be guiding outings to special photographic spots in and around Addo. They will be on hand to assist the newer photographers with composition, camera handling etc. GPS co-ordinates (and old fashioned directions) will be provided for those who prefer not to photograph in groups.

The programme has been adjusted slightly in that the mainstream lectures will finish at 14h30 each afternoon. There will however be optional practical and theoretical workshops following this which will be divided for beginners and more advanced workers.

We have included lectures and workshops on the most popular subjects listed on the feedback forms and these include – In search of a better photograph; guidance on how to make your images better in field, rather than via post processing – Bird Photography – Photographing the Addo Elephants – Photoshop Recipes – Photographing People – Creative Macro & Abstract – Travelling with a camera – Night time photography.

Almost everyone agreed that the competitions were good fun and would like them to be repeated BUT with the addition of feedback – the closing date will therefore be earlier than usual to give our panels of judges time to assess the various entries and to prepare feedback in all three sections i.e. prints, digital and AV.

The final morning is often the time you start wending your way homeward so we will not be offering lunch on that day – we will however be offering everyone the opportunity to hand in images taken during the weekend which the lecturers will assess and give advice on Monday morning.

The theme of the Congress will be Tell me and I forget, show me and I remember, Involve me and I understand (thanks Alicia) – we hope that each and every delegate will get involved in next years congress and enjoy it fully.

#### **MAITLAND CEMETERY PROJECT**



On the 16<sup>th</sup> October 2010 Ancestry24 will carry on with their mammoth project of photographing every headstone in the Cemetery.

As part of their civic duty and preservation of National Heritage these headstones once photographed and tagged will be available to the public for free on the <a href="Managestry24">Ancestry24</a> website's gallery. <a href="http://gallery.ancestry24.com/v/cemeteries/cape/">http://gallery.ancestry24.com/v/cemeteries/cape/</a>

With over 100 000 souls buried in this huge cemetery it covers a massive span of 100 hectares. The first burial took place on 16 January 1886. This graveyard is now nearing its capacity and needs to be retained as a haven of remembrance as well as a place where it is safe to walk around the rich heritage of the famous and not so famous people who have made the City of Cape Town what it is today.

A large proportion of bodies from the old Somerset Road Cemetery have been reinterred in Maitland Cemetery. Many of the headstones are laid out as paths, some put up against the wall and others lay buried under mounds of mole hills.

Burials from 1888 – 1925 have already been transcribed and will be launched soon.

- 2 projected images.
