- I have to plan my entries to the main Helderberg Photographic Society meetings better so that I enter the full quota of entries each night. The real challenge will be the Set Subjects which are sure to stimulate some creativity and force me to think outside my creative box. This will take care of the second Wednesday of each month.
- On the first Wednesday there is the Black and White group meeting, and as I really like
 this medium I will just have to attend that meeting. After having gone to the last meeting
 and seen the huge improvement in the standard of Black and White images in the club,
 this will be a huge challenge.

AMENDMENT TO THE NUMBER OF IMAGES SUBMITTED FOR COMPETITION AND EVALUATION

Please note the following: From January 2012, the number of images submitted for Competition will be limited to <u>3 prints and 3 projected images</u> (ie. 2 in Open and 1 in Set Subject, or, 2 in Set Subject and 1 in Open, in both print and projected formats. (We used to have 8 submissions allowed – now it is 6). In order to promote the submission of prints, JJ has offered a prize to be handed out at the end of 2012, for the print with the most points. The prize is a voucher for a canvas print of your print!

As we intend getting into Evaluation and Judging in a big way in 2012, the number of submissions will be restricted to *ONE* image per member (either a print, or a projected image). In so doing, we will be able to give every submission the time and evaluation it deserves.

I wonder if I could ask you to put out a feeler in a future newsletter for an item I am looking for? I need a replacement light bulb for my old Rollei P11 slide projector which I use to project my medium format slides. The lightbulb is 300 watts, 220 volts and has 6280C/05 engraved on it. It is about 10 cm long, 3 cm diameter, and has 4 spikes/connectors plus the main locator at the bottom. Maybe there are still some members who have not thrown out their old stuff. I have been taking medium format since I was at school (OK, it was B&W then) and have no intention of stopping! On a midyear holiday this year in Zim the only camera I took was a Mamiya TLR and 4 lenses. Not a bad option for photographing the total lunar eclipse! Also the unpredictable power

supply was no hindrance, with the only power needed being a single AA battery for my light meter, everything else being mechanical.

Anyway, I didn't mean to be so long winded, I was just going to fill in the info you asked for. Hope to be at the Gala evening.
