Through the Chairman's Viewfinder:

If you didn't make to the Moon Shoot outing you missed an awful lot of fun and a chance to capture really good images – a big thank you to Nettie and Andre and to everybody who brought tow ropes! I have mentioned it before but taking part in a club outing is really enjoyable. If you are new to our club it is a great opportunity to get to know some fellow members. Some people may feel a little bit awkward or even shy about not knowing how it all works and what people do. Don't worry - just come and you will really enjoy yourself!

One of the wonders of digital photography is that it gives us the chance to experiment – at no cost.

Familiarity can blunt the edge of our creativity and if you have been feeling a bit bored with your photography recently it may well be time to change your regular pattern. The best photographers know that the comfort zone is the enemy of artistic expression. We like our comfort zones because they will normally give us pretty good images if we follow our own guidelines.

Instead try a whole new approach – look for different perspectives constantly – focal lengths, positioning. Use different lenses. Lie down. Try new approaches to composition so you can move beyond the comfort of 'the rule of thirds'.

The old saying of 'f/8 and be there" was more about 'being there" than getting the right exposure. It means that being on the scene is paramount. If you want to break free from your comfort zone you need to throw your all into shooting when on location and never settle for 'good enough'. Always strive to see the image and to capture it. The more time you spend looking the more good images you will find and you will have creative fun!

Play with your exposures – under expose, over expose...if your have the camera or the software, work with bracketing – manually as well as letting the camera handle it. There is a theory that there is no such thing as 'bad' light there is only the right light for a given scene.

All this is even before you begin to think about what you can do with software....

Become really involved in your club and have much more fun with your photography!



GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT ENTRIES

- 1. All work entered in this competition must have been entered for a competition or evaluation by the submitting club during the 12 months preceding the Interclub Competition.
- 2. A member of more than one club can only represent **one** club with prints and/or


projected images.

- 3. Work of the appointed judges cannot be entered.
- 4. Film slides are not accepted for projection. However, scanned images may be entered as digital images, as set out in the section Digital Images.
- 5. Each entry must be named as set out in the sections on Prints and Digital Images below.
- 6. A maximum of 24 entries per club is allowed, consisting of 12 prints and 12 projected images.
- 7. Clubs who do not have prints at their club competitions are given the option to print digital images and submit them.
- 8. No more than two entries from any one member may be entered.
- 9. Entries not adhering to the rules will not be judged.

PRINTS

- 1. Prints must be mounted on board, but not framed or block-mounted.
- 2. Prints must be clearly marked by means of an arrow on the back, indicating the right way up.
- 3. The title of the print, the name of photographer and club must be clearly labelled on the back of the print (see example at the end of this section).
- 4. The *minimum* size of a print (without its mount) is 150 mm x 200 mm. (6" x 8")
- 5. The *maximum* size of a print (without its mount) is 300 mm x 450 mm. (12" x 18")
- 6. The maximum size of the mount board may not exceed 400 mm x 550 mm.
- 7. No distinction will be made between hand-derived and machine prints.
- 8. To avoid one print standing out from the others, prints will be hung and judged as follows: B&W first, then soft colours, then bright colours.
- 9. All print entries must be accompanied by a digital copy conforming to the same standard as set out in the next section on digital images.
- 10. Note all prints will remain on display in the Sanlam Gallery for two weeks after the Competition, and will only be available for collection thereafter.

Example of Print Label:



DIGITAL IMAGES

- 1. No film slide entries will be accepted.
- 2. Digital images must be in JPEG format.
- 3. Digital images must be resized to a maximum of 1024 (horizontal) x 768 (vertical) pixels.
- 4. File sizes for JPEG images may not exceed 500 Kb.
- 5. Each JPEG image file must be named as follows:
- The file name must be by the Club and the numerical number within the club batch; the author's name; and the title of the image.
- These three groups must be separated by an underscore.
- The first group representing the Club must use the following codes: (A = Cape Town; B = Creative; C = Fish Hoek; D = Helderberg; E = Hermanus; F = Tygerberg; G = Tafelberg; H = Paarl; I = Swartland; J = West Coast PS), followed by the numerical number of the picture in that division (e.g. 01, 02, 03... 12) The number must always consist of two digits so as not to cause confusion with the way the computer files are stored.

- The second group must include the author's name truncated to a maximum of 16
- characters (e.g. joe basson).
- The third group must include the title truncated to a maximum of 24 characters (e.g. blue
- heron at dawn). Only figures and letters, and eventually the underscore (_) that separates the various groups may be used.
- NB: All letters (except the Club letter allocated above) must be in lower case.
- Example: A01_joe basson_kids at play.jpg

(The underscore has been adopted to prevent confusion with names which are hyphenated.)

PROMOTION OF INTER-CLUB

All prints (in their digital format) and all PDIs will be put together in a Power Point format, and will be displayed in the Head Office Building before, during and for two weeks after the Competition in order to promote photography and advertise the annual event of our Inter-Club.

We are most grateful to Sanlam for their support and allowing us to use their excellent facilities, and for the opportunity to publically display the best images from each club.

FEES PAYABLE

- 1. **Participation Fee per club:** There will be a club fee charge of R350.
- 2. Entrance Fee per person: Each ticket will cost R60.
- 3. **Pre-Selling of tickets:** In order to place not too severe a financial burden upon the host club, all participating clubs will be required to pre-sell a minimum number of tickets before the event. This number is set at 20 tickets. If more tickets are required, the chairman of each club must advise Jacoba van Zyl of the number of extra tickets desired, by 15 September.
- 4. Any club which is not able to sell their 20 tickets can return them to Jacoba van Zyl by 15 September in order to redistribute them to clubs who require more.
- 5. Payment of tickets by bank transfer or EFT only, to the following account:

JUDGING

CTPS has nominated the following judges:

JUDGING PROCEDURE

- 1. To ensure a smooth-running event, there will be no live judging on the evening. All images will be pre-judged.
- 2. On a predetermined evening set within two weeks prior to the 25th October, each judge will award points for each entry (both Prints and PDIs) on a scale of 1 to 30.
- 3. Prints shall be properly exhibited and the title of each print will be displayed below the print. To standardise the labels, they will all be printed by CTPS. The judges will be required to complete a scoring sheet when judging the prints.
- 4. When displaying a digital image, its title will be announced when it appears on the screen, followed by the recording of judges' overall score, before proceeding to the next image.
- 5. Hardcopies of detailed score sheets and results will be available on the completion of the competition.
- 6. CTPS will appoint one projectionist and one score recorder.

AWARDS

- 1. Certificates will be provided by the host club.
- 2. Prizes will be organised by CTPS.

CLUB AWARDS

1. A certificate will be awarded to the club scoring the most points in the print section, and

to the club scoring the most points in the projected images section.

2. The Interclub Floating Trophy and a certificate will be awarded to the club attaining First

Place when the points accumulated in the print and digital images sections are added together. Certificates will also be awarded to those clubs attaining Second and Third Places.

- 3. In the event of a tie in the print section, the projected image section or the overall event,
 - certificates will be awarded to all clubs who have tied for a place and the trophy will be shared.
- 4. The winning club(s) must have the trophy engraved with their name(s) and the date of the competition.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

- 1. Certificates will be awarded to the photographers scoring First, Second and Third places in both prints and projected images sections. It is at CTPS's discretion to award prizes.
- 2. These images will be displayed when the announcements are made.
- 3. In the event of a tie, it shall be up to the judges to decide the winner.
- 4. The Judges' decisions are final.
- 5. The Apple Award will be awarded to the photographer scoring the highest number of points.
- 6. In the event of a tie for the Apple Award, the Judges will choose an outright winner.

JUDGES' AWARDS

Each Judge will choose his/her favourite image of the event, and this will be displayed when the Judges announce their choices. If enough donations are obtained then the Judges and the authors of the selected images could also be given a small prize.


HANDING IN, AND COLLECTION, OF ENTRIES

- All PDI images from each club must be handed in on one memory stick, together with the Prints to Detlef Basel at the Cape Town Science Centre at 470 B Main Rd, Observatory in front of Groote Schuur Hospital by Friday 4th October 2013, no later than 16h00.
- The Interclub Floating Trophies (which must have been inscribed by the previous winner/s), must be handed in at the same time as the prints, to Detlef Basel.
- 3. Each Club is responsible for notifying the secretary when entries have been handed in.
- 4. Any late or incorrectly sized or marked, entries will not be accepted.
- 5. All entries will be exhibited for two weeks after the Competition.
- 6. Clubs will be notified by email when Prints are ready for collection from the Science Centre.
- 7. Although every effort will be made to set up the digital projector in line with the generally accepted guidelines, no guarantee can be provided that images will perfectly match that which is displayed on another computer.
- 8. The Copyright of all images entered will be protected.

PROCEEDINGS ON THE EVENING

- 1. Parking on the premises, with security guards, is available at guests' own risk. To facilitate a guide to the security department at Sanlam, it is requested that each club provide CTPS with a list of attendees by 4th October 2013.
- 2. Guests may arrive from 18h00 onwards, and a program setting out the schedule of the evening will be available upon guests' arrival.
- 3. Viewing of the prints will take place at the art gallery adjacent to the auditorium.
- 4. A Finger Supper and wine and fruit juice will be served, at no charge. A cash bar will also be available.
- 5. Guests must have taken their seats in the auditorium by 19h10 promptly.
- 6. Proceedings will commence at 19h15.
- 7. During the Intermission, tea, coffee and biscuits will be served.
- 8. The evening should be concluded by 23h00.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

THERE IS ONLY ONE CATEGORY - OPEN.

Photographers are encouraged to explore the photographic medium and to use it to communicate their own personal vision incorporating feeling, senses and imagination to the viewer. The photography is not restricted in any way, neither in subject matter nor manipulation during the taking or reproduction stages of the photography.

Entry is open to single entrants, groups and clubs. All participants must be disclosed on the entry form.

Entrants may submit any number of AVs but are limited to a combined total duration of 15 minutes.

Copyright:

Submission of an entry implies that the entrant has obtained any necessary licences or permission to use any copyright material included in the sequence.

Resolution:

From 1024 x 768 px (4:3 aspect ratio) up to 1920 x 1080 px (16:9 aspect ratio) may be submitted.

File size:

The file size of a sequence should not exceed 500Mb.

AVs may contain the entrant's name and should acknowledge the work of other artists (e.g. music).

AVs may be submitted on a CD or DVD to the postal address above or via an internet service provider such as www.wetransfer.com, Google docs, etc. but need to be received prior to the closing date.

Email your entry form (with tracking number, if applicable) to <u>roelvanoza@gmail.com</u> so that we can follow up on the arrival of your CD/DVD/file transfer.


