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CHAIRMAN'S NOTE

We are in the middle of the winter months, a beautiful time of the year for great mood shots – but of course you can get down into those detail shots as well, as there is so much beauty in the detail! We are surrounded by so much beauty that perhaps sometimes we become blunted to what has just become "everyday" to us. When we step outside of our routine on foreign soil all your senses seem to reawaken. Those trips away are a wonderful opportunity to view the world with rekindled enthusiasm and invariably, the subjects which strike us as most interesting are the very same things that locals probably don't look at twice! Often though, we tend to largely shoot the all-

encompassing view in favour of a much tighter frame of reference. So whether on home turf or on that fabulous trip away where the senses are heightened, rather than just shoot broad views, street scenes and wide angle vistas, consider isolating only those telling details which convey the places real uniqueness, to build up a real sense of the place and its character. Training your eye to the smaller details, such as window boxes, street signs, rickety old chairs etc., helps you to realise just what a significant part they play in forming the complete picture. Look for miniature scenes with a strong narrative. This type of picture can sum up the mood of the place more effectively than a wide angle grab shot where you are trying to sum up everything in one shot. Try to make a mental list of what you think the surprises and treats the place you visit may have to offer and then plan your exploration of them with a more discerning eye!

We had really great entries in both the projected and print categories at July's black and white meeting (as well as a fascinating presentation on Edward Sheriff Curtiss by Roger), so I am really looking forward to what you will all serve up at the main meeting on 8 July – see you there!




