# OK, let's get started!

The LAST day of this Challenge is Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> March ... therefore the 1<sup>st</sup> March is the last day on which you can start this Challenge, the idea being that you make one image every day, consecutively, for 30 days. You may start this Challenge any time from 15<sup>th</sup> December onwards, but you MUST then make 30 images in the following 30 days. OR, you could start on 1<sup>st</sup> January for example ... then you have to complete the challenge on the 30<sup>th</sup> January... This means you need to have your camera handy, and hopefully you have looked at the subjects and perhaps can plan a little ahead if you find a 'difficult' subject in the days ahead. PLEASE do not dip into your Archives – the idea is to get used to using your camera regularly!

Let's take the first subject: 'Self Portrait'

Instead of doing the easiest thing (taking a selfie with your cell phone), why don't you take out your tripod, affix your camera, work out the back ground and the settings, *and use the self-timer????!!!!* (some of us might need to go back and look up the self-timer instructions in the camera manual – but that is a good thing!).

The next thing is to take your image to the software, whichever one you use.

Edit you image. Label your image, preferably at the bottom, as follows:





- 2. Resize the image to club sizes ie. 1920 x 1080
- 3. Sharpen and Save

- 4. Store in a 'Challenge' file
- 5. Once you have reached Day 30, upload to a stick and bring to a Club Meeting. At every Club Meeting we will be showing a couple of Challenge submissions!
- 6. Some of these subjects seem quite 'normal'... however, if you have the time and inclination, explore more creative ways of photographing the subject ... you may even surprise yourself!



# An invitation to participate in Challenge 3-2-1 (and organize a judging session in South Africa)

Challenge 3-2-1 is an international contest for short Audio Visuals with a maximum runtime of 3 min. 21 seconds. This short runtime is the "Challenge" for the authors. Until 2014 the contest was organized by the French photo club Gaphe in Hayange (France), lead by Ricardo Zarate. After a two year break the contest is now continued by a German team.

How it works:

Authors send their AV-sequences to the organizers in Germany by Internet transfer (Closing date for entries 31. 03. 2017).

Entry fee E10.

The organizers will distribute the AVs to various host clubs in several countries for judging.

Each host club returns a ranking and the organizers will create a total ranking. The best authors will receive a monetary award.

Judging sessions will take place in different countries. The organizers are awaiting applications for judging an event from a maximum of three stations per country. # Steve's Corner #14

# **Adobe Subscription Model**

Last month we looked at some issues related to Adobe's switch to a subscription model for their Creative Suite (now Creative Clouds) applications. I have since found a few more articles that look at this so here are links to those.

#### Camera brands

We've all heard, or more likely read on the internet, a rant that some brand or other is better than the others. In the digital age the brand mentioned has usually one of the big two, Canon or Nikon.

Personally I get quite annoyed at jibes against one brand or another; it is lately said that there are no bad cameras being made today, so why should we care what brand of camera somebody uses. If you consider yourself superior because you use a Canik while X is clearly an idiot for using a Nican; this surely says much more about you than it does about either camera brand.

In her article Why your camera brand doesn't matter (https://goo.gl/1SbbeX), Daniela Bowker looks at this from the perspective of being asked by a friend, "Daniela, I want to buy M a camera. What should I get her?" and concludes that what really matters is that you know what you're doing with your kit and the camera that you use affords you all the control that you need.

Format magazine takes a somewhat tongue in cheek approach to this with a statistical analysis that answers the question What Your Favorite Camera Brand Says About You (https://goo.gl/decsVq)

Keenan Hastings writes that <u>Camera Brand Loyalty is Overrated</u> (https://goo.gl/PRA9CQ) and concludes "The old me would have stayed with Fujifilm just because that's what I was loyal to, but as a photographer, I have to go with the system that meets my photographic needs, not the brand that best 'represents' me."

Ken Rockwell, whom everyone either seems to love or hate takes a serious look at <u>Nikon vs.</u> <u>Canon</u> (https://goo.gl/kpPk) from a variety of technical and usability aspects. At the end he gives his personal preference, but says "Either is an excellent choice, and only you can determine which is best for you."

At the end of the day, the important thing, as Ms. Bowker says, is that you have the knowledge to get the best out of your chosen equipment. I like <u>Scott Bourne</u>'s (http://scottbourne.com) opinion on this; he suggests that our camera user manuals form part of our daily routine, that we should read a few pages every day so that we don't miss out on those slightly hidden, but oh so useful features. You paid a lot of money for that camera; don't settle for using just its basic features.

Just this morning the importance of this was highlighted at our outing to Kalk Bay, when Paddy, a Nikon user wondered how to set her camera in some specific way. Around her were several Canon users, a Sony user, and myself, a Fujifilm user. We understood what she was after but none of us were any help in finding the correct settings in her camera's menu

system. Would it be nice if all cameras had the same user interface for shared features, differing only if features unique to themselves? I don't think this would so great; I like the way my camera's controls work. They suit me perfectly.
